MENS SOCCER (0-8-2, 3-10-3)

Saturday, Spokane (5-2-2, 5-5-6) home.

The second place Sasquatch visit Mike Hollis Field Saturday.

Spokane has a four-match win streak over Wenatchee Valley, including a 1-0 win in the Lilac City a couple weeks ago.

Over the years the Sasquatch have dominated the Knights, posting a 21-6-3 record.

Spokane may be the King of Ties. Six of their 16 matches have ended with no winner or loser.

And the beat rolls on. The Black & Silver may be setting some kind of a record for squeakers. Of their last eight matches, seven have been decided by a single goal and the other was a tie. Unfortunately WVC last lost six of the seven.

The latest posting on the league site has WVC facing Clackamas and Clark Friday. Wenatchee has faced each three times in the past and is 0-3 vs. Clackamas and 1-2 vs. Clark.
