

Nine Knights named Eastern Region All-Stars

In a season that saw the Knights win the Eastern Region by a four-game margin, an amazing nine players were recognized for their efforts.



Five players were voted onto the second team. Sophomore Designated Hitter **Robin James** had a great season hitting .345 with 16 doubles and 27 runs scored. Another sophomore, **Chelsea Allsbrook**, was selected at first base. Chelsea hit .353 for the Knights with three home runs and 35 runs



batted in. Four freshmen played their way onto the second team. Shortstop **Kaylee Larson**

showed tremendous growth at the toughest position on the field and ended up hitting .328, scoring 28 runs and clubbing three home runs.

Baylee Jolliffe, who missed the last month of the season due to injury, was still impressive enough to make the all-league team in the outfield. Baylee hit a rock solid .402 as the team's leadoff hitter, had 45 hits and stole 13 bases in 34 games. Our wall behind the plate all year, **Cassie Ellis** put together a fantastic freshman campaign. She hit .405, drove in 34 runs and led the team with seven home runs, including two she hit at the NWAACC Championship Tournament. In addition to her bat, she threw out 11 would-be base stealers and had only two passed balls in 42 games.



The players selected to the first team this year hit in the heart of the lineup and made things happen for the Knights. Freshman **Chynna Sandhop** and sophomore **Amanda TeVelde** were both selected in the

outfield. Chynna ended the season hitting .404 in part because she hit .571 over the last four games of the year; she also scored 32, stole 22

bases and robbed numerous base hits with her diving catches in the outfield. Amanda patrolled center field all year for the Knights and was the anchor of the league's best outfield. TeVelde hit .384 with 13

doubles, seven triples and three home runs. She led the team in RBI's with 35, 53 hits and 46

runs scored. As if that weren't enough, she also stole 20 bases while only being caught one

time. For the second year in a row, **Emma Winckler** was recognized as the league's top third

baseman. Emma hit .375, scored 30 runs and drove in another 30. She led the team with 19

doubles and had a fielding percentage of .958 at the hot corner. When Emma wasn't playing

third base she moved to pitching circle where her record was 8-2 and her earned run average was a mere 0.79. Freshman pitcher

Sydnee Jerome was selected as the Eastern Region Most Valuable Pitcher in 2010, an honor that was well deserved and hard earned. Jerome posted a stellar 20-5 record with a 1.48 earned run average. She recorded 99 strikeouts while surrendering only 21 base-on-balls in 166 innings pitched. Opposing hitters hit only .219 against

Sydnee this season and only scored 35 earned runs all year. Most impressive is the fact that Jerome did not lose a game she started against Eastern Region opponents.

Emma Winckler and **Sydnee Jerome** were further recognized for their efforts by being selected the **NFCA All-American Team**, which recognizes the top 12 players in the entire NWAACC. Congratulations to all of our honorees, it is well deserved.





The nine players who received post season honors played a big part in the team's success this spring, as did their teammates whose names didn't make the list. We are a program that prides itself on being a **TEAM** above all else and in keeping with our belief, here are some facts that let you know how important each player's contributions were. Sophomore pitcher **Kim Harter** posted a 10-2 record this year with a 2.63 earned run average. Additionally, Kim surrendered only one home run in 88 innings pitched and limited opponents to a .259 batting average. Sophomore **Katrina Peterson** had another solid season for the Knights and was a huge reason our pitching staff put up the numbers they did. Pete again played second base with reckless abandon, stealing numerous hits up the middle and in the hole. She had 36 hits, scored 30 runs and drove in another 30.



Ashlee Richardson played in 30 games this year and made the most of her opportunities. She hit .276 and more importantly scored 16 runs for the team this spring. She was ready to go at every opportunity and displayed the work ethic that is so important to our success.



Moe Stuart was counted on to come in late in games and use her great glove at first base to secure victories. The most obvious time she did this was the first game of the year against Spokane. The Knights held a 1-0 in the top of the seventh inning and Spokane had the tying run at third base with two outs. Moe came across the bag for an errant throw, held her foot on the bag and secured the catch during a collision with the runner, and her team had a very important Eastern Region victory. Moe also had seven hits in 14 at-bats and scored 10 runs this year. **Kelsie DeBroeck's** season began with a bang, a grand slam home run in Arizona to be exact, and she never stopped. Kelsie led the team with a .420 batting average including 10 doubles, four home runs and 36 runs



scored. Last but not least, **Amy Greenough** helped her team even though she could not take the field this season. She gave us the best batting practice pitcher in the NWAACC and was a great help to the development of our other pitchers by sharing her knowledge and enthusiasm.
