*The **NEW!** math requirement for Elementary Education Majors is **Math 171, 172, 173** for CWU, EWU and WSU. Take **Math 171, 172** for UW. WWU keeps their elementary education math requirements in-house. Take a course that will get you the AAS degree for transfer to WWU. (Other colleges see below.*)

Remember: UW offers education only on the graduate (post –baccalaureate) level.

You must apply to both your university of choice and the Education Department at the university. You must be accepted to both the university and the department to major in Education. Non- Elementary Education majors must also apply to their chosen specific discipline department (Math, English, History etc.)

**Few people take exactly 90 credits for an AAS degree. Even fewer people take exactly 180 credits for a BAEd from a quarter school (120 credits from a semester school).
