KNOW all men by these presents that I Samuel Dunbar of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky for and in consideration of the sum of seventy pounds specie currency of Kentucky hath bargained and sold unto James Moore one Negro lad named Charles which said Negro lad named Charles I do warrant to him the said James Moore I do hereby warrant and forever defend against the claim of me and my heirs and against the claim of all and all manner of persons whats oever In Witness whereof I have unto set my hand and affixed my seal this ninth day of January 1801

Shuck to Adam Shepherd Bill of sale

This Indenture made this thirteenth day of July in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and one between Adam Shepherd of the County of Bullitt and State of Kentucky of the one part and John Helm and Thomas Gates of the County of Washington and state aforesaid of the other part Witness eth that the said Adam Shepherd for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and eighty four Dollars in hand paid by John Helm aforesaid and three hundred twelve and a half Dollars in hand paid by Thomas Gates have bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain sell and confirm unto the said John Helm and Thomas Gates their heirs &c forever a certain tract or parcel of land containing by survey Four hundred Acres Situate lying and being in the County of Bullitt on the south side of long lick Creek entered in the name of Shelman and Owings and patented to the said Adam Shepherd including the plantation and buildings whereon the said ^{Adam} Shepherd now lives and bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at a white Oak on the bank of said Creek about one hundred poles above stony run thence up the meanders of the said Creek binding thence three hundred and sixteen poles to a Sugar tree and thence in Chins line and Philips's line thence with the said line South fifty Degree East three hundred poles to two Beeches and poplar near the Corners of King, John & Philips's, Thence south forty five Degree West two hundred and fifty poles to two Ashes and Walnut thence north twenty eight Degree West one hundred and twenty poles to three Ashes corner to the said Adam Shepherd four hundred Acres Survey bought of Jesse Rude, thence with a line thence North 65° West 60 poles to white Oak and Beech thence North 15° West 224 poles to the beginning and its appurtenances to have and to hold the said tract or parcel
