

granted unto my said son John Mercer after the decease of me and my wife Elizabeth the one half of my Plantation whereon I now live as also half the Benefitt of the houses Orchards Woods and Lands which doth belong unto the said Plantation during his Natural life and if it should so happen that my said son John Mercer should within the space of seven years after the date of these presents Marry and die before his wife then I do give and grant unto my Daughter in Law the Widow of my son John Mercer the half of my Plantation with the appurtenances as aforesaid during her Widowhood and in case my said Daughter in Law Widow of my son John Mercer should Marry or die then I give and bequeath all my Right title and Interest of the above said Plantation with the premises as aforesaid unto my well beloved son Robert Mercer to him and his heirs and assigns for ever More In Witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and Seal this 23rd day of February Anno Domini 1733/4
