This Indenture made this 26<sup>th</sup> Day of July 1797 Between Francis Blundell and bathanin his wife of the one part and Thomas Bath of the other part Witnesseth that the said Francis Blundell and bathanin <sup>his wife</sup> for and in consideration of the sum of sixty pounds to them in hand paid the receipt whereof they doth hereby acknowledge, Bath Bargained and sold and doth by these presents grant bargain and sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Thomas Bath his Heirs &c one meysage or parcel of ground situated in the Town of Shepherdsville and bounded as follows, that is to say Beginning at James Browns south corner of Lot N<sup>o</sup> 19 and running thence to the publick ground thence with the said publick ground the distance of forty feet thence in the same course forty feet further making in the whole length eighty feet thence at a right angle in a straight direction to the said Browns said Lot thence with the same to the Beginning it being part of Lot N<sup>o</sup> 20. on which the said Blundell now lives To have and to hold the said meysage or parcel of ground to the said Thomas Bath his Heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use benefit and behoof of him the said Thomas Bath his Heirs and assigns forever. and the said Francis Blundell and bathanin his wife doth covenant and agree to and with the said Thomas Bath that they will warrant and defend the Title of the said premises to the said Thomas Bath & his Heirs forever against the claim of any person or persons whatsoever. in Witness whereof the said Francis Blundell and bathanin his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals this day and year first above written

This Indenture made this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven between John Whitaker and Mary Whitaker his wife of the one part of Shelbe county, and Micheal Trotman of Bullitt county of the other part. Both of the State of Kentucky. Witnesseth that the said John and Mary Whitaker his wife, for, and in consideration of the sum of three hundred pounds to him in hand paid at and before the signing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said John and Mary Whitaker doth hereby acknowledge, the said John and Mary Whitaker hath granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents, doth grant bargain, sell, alien, and confirm, unto the said Micheal Trotman, and his heirs and assigns forever, all their right title, and interest, of in to a certain tract or parcel of Land (situate lying and being in the county of Bullitt on the south side of Salt River, about one half mile from the mouth of Cedar creek) containing one Hundred Acres of Land bounded as follows: Beginning at a walnut and Beech near Elijah Whitakers corner running thence south nine degrees East ten poles to an Iron wood on the North side of Cedar creek thence down the same with Owings line S 75 west twenty five poles to a Beech -
