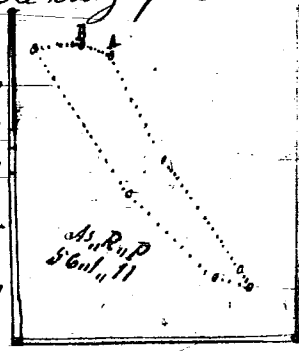

At a County Court held for Thomas Hopewell adm^r
Spencer County on Monday the 18th day of October 1830 This List
of Sales of the Estate of John Hopewell Dec^d was reviewed and
ordered to be recorded Attest. Raph^d E. Sawaster, C. S. C.

we the undersigned being appointed by the Spencer County Court to lay off and
allot to Sarah Collings widow relict of Benjamin Collings Dec^d her dower
in the said slaves and personal estate of which her Dec^d husband Dec^d and
seized and possessed we met on the premises on the 21st day of September 1830
and being sworn and having examined and ascertained the quantity of land
belonging to the said Collings dec^d finding the tract to contain 183 3/4 acres
of 33 poles we then proceeded to lay off and allot to the said Sarah Colling her
dower that is to say one third part of the said tract of land which is described
in the plat herewith attached and is bounded as follows to wit
Beginning at a Redoubt standing on the west bank of Plum Creek
on a line of Natha Nelsons and running thence with Nelsons line
South 85° 10 3/4 poles to a bush of sugar tree in a branch on said Nelsons
line thence South 35° East 139 poles to a stone near a branch on the South side
of the road leading Shelbyville to Shepherdsville thence South 47° East 102
poles to a hickory tree standing near the South East corner of the old apple
orchard thence South 75° East 28 poles to three sugar trees standing on the
west bank of Plum creek thence up the creek and in the middle thereof
249 poles to the place of Beginning containing 5.6 acres 19 quarter & 11 poles
of land together with the mansion house and other out building barn &
Stables &c we then proceeded to allot the said Sarah Collings her dower
in the slaves of the said Benjamin Colling Dec^d there being 4 in number
and their names are as follows to wit

- negro man named Noaj
- yo woman Dec^d Jude
- 10^o Gore 10^o Delian
- Total value
