In the first place I leave and bequeath to my wife Annis Durham now Annis Beauchamp the tract of land in which I reside known by the name of the Greenberry Harris tract together with my woods pasture with the fencing as they now stand together with the grain on the farm at my decease to have and to hold the same during her natural life after which to return to my three younger Sons Maxwell, Alfred and Robinson Beauchamps, also four milch cows my waggon and two yoke of Oxen also ten horses Tom and Bull and one Sorrel mare which I bought of my Father all the household and Kitchen furniture and so many of the farming tools as will be necessary to cultivate the farm also my Slave the Leg. Mary Ann and Bob to have and to hold them during her natural life after which to go to my younger Sons Maxwell, Alfred and Robinson Beauchamps. It is my will and desire that my wife shall have the use and labor of my Slaves Henry, Tell, Isaac and Charles till my sons Maxwell, Alfred and Robinson become of proper age to claim them unto whom I will them forever. In the second place I leave and bequeath to my three younger Sons Maxwell, Alfred and Robinson Beauchamps all my lands in Nelson County save what I leave Lydia together with the tract in Washington County which I bought of William Bryan together with all my Slaves save Clara and her child after my debts are paid it is my wish and desire that my father's other stock grain and will'd holdin and all my dues and rents go to pay my debts and if necessary that Docta and Mimmy be sold and if any money be left to go to Maxwell, Alfred and Robinson Beauchamps. In the third place I leave to my three Daughters Polly, Susan and Katharine and to their husbands Joseph M^o Clasky, James M^o Brown and William Hobbs my Mills in Washington County together with the tract of land belonging thereto with the exception of Ten acres square to be laid off on the road leading from my mill to Springfield where my land and John Shackletts join for Sally Fowler during her life time by her not selling or leasing away her right together with one Acre in Nelson County condemned for the use of the settlement by Joseph M^o Clasky paying to my son John W. Beauchamp four hundred Dollars currency of the State, James M^o Brown three hundred of the same and William Hobbs three hundred of the same to be paid as he J. W. Beauchamp needs it. In the fourth place I leave to my daughter Lydia Hobbs and her children the tract of land adjoining Josiah Marshall and Thomas Dawson which was sold by an order of Court and I became the purchaser, By Joshua Hobbs pay two hundred dollars Kentucky currency to my daughter Sally Brown and two hundred more to my estate as fast as the place will rent for the money - In the fifth place I leave my daughter Sally Brown and her children after her my Slave Clara and her child Edward and the two hundred dollars from Joshua Hobbs.
