

In the sixth place I leave to my Son John W. Beauchamp one thousand dollars out of the Mills to be paid to him by Mr. Clasky, Brown and Hobbs as before named in Currency of the State. In the last place I do appoint Joseph M. Clasky and William Hobbs the sole Executors of this my last will and Testament sensible of my approaching end I subscribe my name with my own hand this 3rd day of September 1825.

In the case of the writing produced purporting to be a copy of the last will and Testament of Newell Beauchamp appearing by their Attorneys, and the evidence of Witnesses being heard the Court upon consideration as judge I decide that said writing be established and ordered to be recorded as the last will and Testament of said Newell Beauchamp deceased. And on the motion of Joseph M. Clasky one of the Executors therein named he having given bond with James M. Brown, Samuel Carpenter, Mr. Hobbs & Richard L. Murphy his securities in the penalty of \$6000. Conditioned as prescribed by law and having taken the oath the law in such case directs, It is ordered that a certificate of probate of said will be granted him.

In the name of God Amen. I William May Gov. of Nelson County and State of Kentucky being of sound Mind and Memory do make this my last will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills made by me and I give & bequeath to William Cox, Son of General James Cox, a Negro boy named Henry, I give and bequeath John Dennis Cox, a negro boy named Asa, I give and bequeath to Caroline Cox, a negro girl named Dilsey, I give and bequeath to Lucinda Cox, a negro girl named Martha, I give and bequeath to Washington Cox a negro boy named Sampson, to them and their heirs forever. I give and bequeath to Laura Cox & Martha Cox a negro woman named Harriet, but it is my Will that my Niece Mary Cox Wife of General James Cox, shall have possession of Harriet during her the said Mary's life, and at her death, Harriet and her increase to be equally divided between the said Laura and Martha Cox & their heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my Nephew Smith Cox & his heirs forever a Negro Boy named John, a girl named Ora, and a boy named William. I give and bequeath to my Nephew Isaac May Son of John W. May, a negro boy named Willis. I give and bequeath to John May Son of the said John W. May a negro boy named Moss. I give and bequeath to James May, Son of John W. May, a negro boy named Dred to them & their heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my Nephew Richard May a negro boy named Fielding to him & his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my Nephew John Coke three Negro boys viz. Jeremiah, John and Mathew to him and his heirs forever. All the residue of my Estate, consisting of lands, Negroes, Cask, Bonds, and every other species of Property I give to my Nephew Stephen May and his heirs forever.
