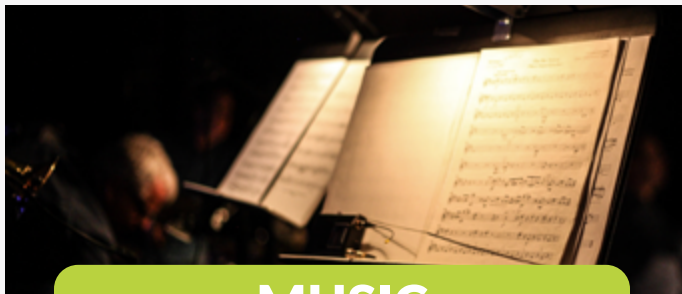

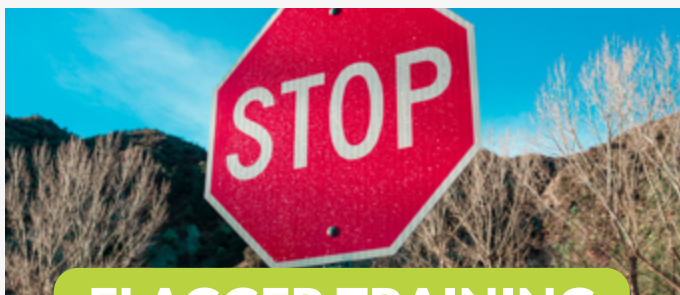

PARKING

Parking permits can be obtained at the cashier's office in Wenatchi Hall. Parking permits are registered to the purchaser.

Permits must be hung from the vehicle's rearview mirror or on the driver's side dashboard with permit information visible from exterior of vehicles.

Standard vehicle permit rates:

STUDENT: \$25/quarter or \$70/year (non-refundable)

EVENING-ONLY: \$15/quarter

DAILY: \$2.00/day

SENIOR STUDENT (60 or older): \$5/quarter

Daily permits are available from machines in the parking lots at Smith Gym, Sexton Hall, Brown Library and the Music and Art Center. The machines accept coins, bills and debit/credit cards.

Discounts for electric or hybrid vehicles are available. To qualify, drivers need to bring their state-issued vehicle registration showing that they have a hybrid or electric vehicle.

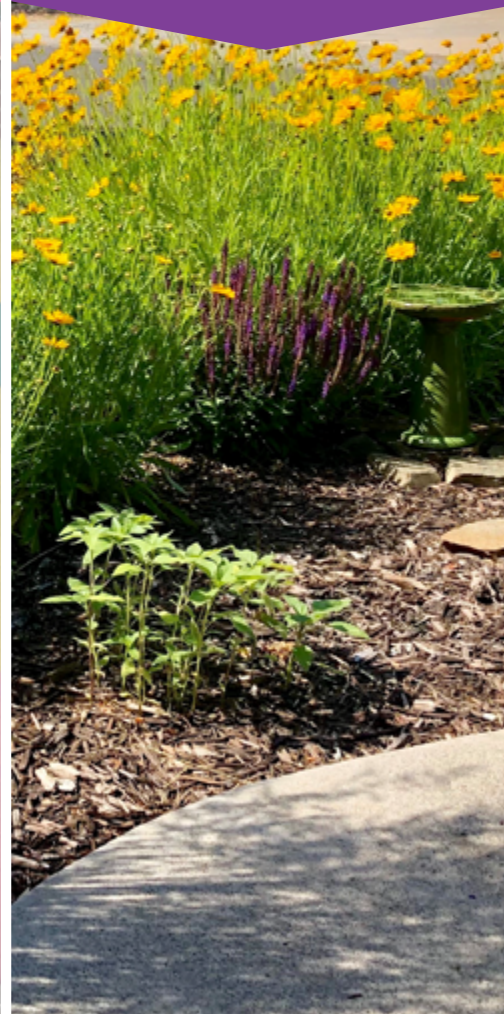
