Spring Program 2020 (Berlin, Germany) Scholarship Application Deadline: Friday, January 10, 2020 at 5pm

General Information

- Two \$1500 scholarships will be awarded to WVC students for a study abroad program with the Washington State Community College Consortium for Study Abroad (WCCCSA).
- You must have applied to the study abroad program and paid the deposit to be eligible to apply for this scholarship.
- This scholarship is awarded based on financial need and a well-worded essay.
- Scholarship recipients will be notified by the end of February.
- Scholarship funds will be dispersed prior to the program start date.
- Read and follow the application checklist below.
- Late and/or incomplete applications will not be considered.

Application Checklist

- □ Apply to the study abroad program and pay the deposit.
- $\hfill\square$ Complete the attached Study Abroad Scholarship Application form.
- □ Complete the 2019/20 FAFSA online at <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>.
- □ If selected, you will be required to send the WVC Foundation a thank you letter before your scholarship will be disbursed.
- □ If selected, you will be required to present on your experience to the WVC Foundation upon your return.
- □ If selected, you must agree to help WVC Study Abroad promote the study abroad program after you complete your program. You will be required to spend no more than 4 hours work on a project mutually agreed upon by both you and the WVC Study Abroad Coordinator. Projects might include, but are not limited to, sharing photos and personal reflections of the program, help with study abroad information sessions or tabling events, talking with classes or clubs to help promote study abroad, making a video to help promote study abroad, etc.

Application Submission

- Are there any distinctive components to this program that will impact your overall learning experience abroad? (i.e. the course work, home-stays, extra-curricular activities, tourist sights, etc.)
- What challenges, if any, did you face in your decision to study abroad? How did you meet these challenges and what impact do you foresee them having on your experience abroad? These could include, but are not limited to, being a parent, being a non-traditional student, having a learning or physical disability, being in a field of study for which it is difficult to incorporate study abroad, etc.
