CALL TO ORDER 12:03pm

1) CONSENT AGENDA

- A. October 2023 Minutes approved by consent without changes.

2) OLD BUSINESS

- A. Update: Year-end Appeal- First postcards are currently at the printer and should hit mailboxes in the next week. December will have a follow-up with a postcard to donors from the last 5 years. An additional postcard will go to the purchased list from last year- Chelan, Douglas, Okanogan County households with income over \$125K. January thank-you will go to participating donors. Giving Tuesday is a national push to donate to non-profits. This year's goal will be the same as last year's goal, which was \$5K. The campaign will kick-off on Philanthropy Day next week. A text-to-give option will be provided as well as social media measures. Give NCW will raise funds for the college readiness bootcamp which has previously come from our unrestricted. This kicks off the day on Thanksgiving.
- B. Debrief: Munchen Haus Benevolent Night- 25% of sales will come to us after last night's event. Some WVC employees stopped by, though no board members attended. We did have some people put in for the raffle, which will be drawn today. It was fairly slow, but this is a month that is typically slower for Leavenworth, the drive is also prohibitive for a lot of people. If we continue to participate, we will look at other months as well as promoting more in the Leavenworth area, hopefully with help from Rotary clubs and board members.
- C. Piatigorsky Foundation Concert- Nov. 8- Wine reception from 5:30-6:30 as usual, with the concert to follow. Attendance is expected to be better this year than last winter's as most snowbird donors are still in town. The musicians and Woods family will go out to dinner with Rachel Evey afterwards as usual as well. If board members attend, they are asked to wear their nametag and mingle.
- D. Update: Communications Specialist- Jill Leonard will wrap up the year-end appeal before leaving. The position closed last week; candidates are currently being reviewed with interviews set to take place at the end of this month. The anticipated start date is December 18th to give adequate time to train with Jill before she leaves.

- A. Knight at the Wild, Feb. 9- Foundation covers the sponsorship fee as part of Gifts Grants Awards to the college. First planning meeting to take place next week. Need board volunteers at the table in the concourse to hand out swag and greet people. We also have a VIP suite, which we will need to decide how we want to use it for this event (alumni

Foundation will likely purchase a block of tickets and we will sell them ourselves, as last year's method turned out to be very difficult and cumbersome on the retail side. This will likely be done through EventBrite so as not to create several records in NFG that may not pan out to be long-term donors.
- B. Business After Hours, Feb. 29, 2024- This will be the first event that Lupe will be the primary planner for. Possibly having student involvement, spotlighting current students, and programming, as well as displaying the new building (CTEI) schematics.

Background

Wenatchee Valley College Foundation sponsors a Wenatchee Wild hockey game (\$3,500) as an opportunity to increase WVC visibility and engage the community. The event is a partnership with the WVC recruitment committee, WVC campus life, ASWVC Student Senate, and the WVC Foundation. WVC Knight at the Wild will be Friday, **February 9, 2024**.

Components

Tableing in the Town Toyota Center concourse will be organized by WVC recruiter Karina Mendoza-Flores. All tables will feature a WVC program, club, or team. There will also be a photobooth, mascots, and a "passport" to visit tables and be entered into a raffle. The foundation and recruitment will share a table.

Tickets will be sold to students by ASWVC and to alumni by the WVC Alumni Network (WVC Foundation). All tickets will be group purchased from the Wild for resale. Alumni tickets will include a branded t-shirt.

Game activities including the puck drop, anthem singer, and intermission will be organized by ASWVC.

Giveaways will be at the door, thrown out during intermission, and available at tables in the concourse. The foundation requested funding from ASWVC to pay for the door giveaway (thundersticks) and will be requesting funding from President Harrison (Gift to the College) for the table giveaways.

Private suite will be reserved for WVC alumni. Distribution of the suite tickets will be led by development director Lupe Brito.

Board Volunteer Needs

1. Table volunteers. Two volunteers for set-up from 4:30pm-6pm. Four volunteers for game shift from 6-8pm. Table volunteers will hand out swag and solicit people to enter the raffle.
2. Suite volunteers. 4 volunteers needed for mingling with WVC alumni guests from 6-9:30pm (depending on length of hockey game).
